The meeting was attended by representatives of the 6 partner organisations involved in the project who discussed the stage of the project and watched together the most important products achieved in the second year of project.

The main products achieved in the second year of the projects are:

Virtual exhibitions of the project, developed by the young adults working in tandem within the creative labs.

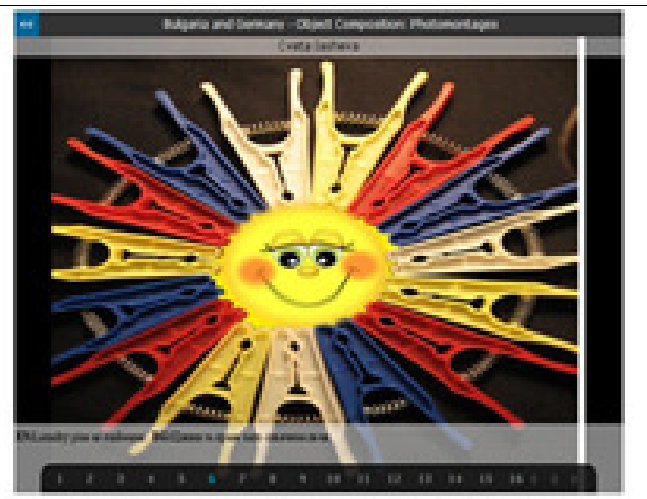
The themes of the three exhibitions are:

Bulgaria and Germany: Object Composition: Photomontages

Romania and Bulgaria: Botanical Garden

Romania and Italy: Historical centre of the city

Each exhibition includes over 35 photos, each photo contains the name of the author and a short description of the photo from the perspective of the author, in English and in his/her native language.



The Good Practices Guide of the project is made of two parts: the first part contains introductory information, the idea of the guide, ICT and Education, Short information about the 'DYACIT' project, while the second part contains concrete information about: the creative laboratory (how the participants were recruited, Workroom equipment, Frequency and organization of meetings), but also the evaluation of the workshops with the help of the trainers and students, methodologies applied within the workshops, virtual communication, improvement of the teaching method in the second year compared to the first, presentation of similar projects, presentation of the partners and bibliography.

The guide is addressed to teachers/trainers of any subject but especially to those who teach arts and foreign languages and who are interested to use more intensely the new technologies in their work.

The CD Guide contains also the chapters How to use the guide and Necessary technical information.

The guide of the project is available in printed format in the languages English and Romanian, and on the CD in the languages English, Romanian, Bulgarian, Italian and German.

>>How to use the Guide

The guide you have just opened is the result of the European project "DYACIT- Developing Young Adults' Creativity through Information Technologies", co-financed by the European Union within the Socrates-Minerva programme.

The objective of the project was to create and develop a flexible innovative learning environment using specific didactic and pedagogical methods with the final goal of capturing the interest and increasing the motivation of the young adults aged between 16-20 years old who have completed 1st level of secondary education, and face the risk of being "early school leavers", in order to determine them to study throughout their whole lifetime.

The main beneficiaries of this guide are the trainers/teachers who work with young adults. In order to serve this aim the guide was developed taking into account the technical possibilities existing in schools and/or organizations in charge of the education of young adults.

The use of the methods presented in the guide requires a minimum of knowledge and abilities.

These are:

- Good computer skills, especially for working with the Office programmes, browsers as well as good skills for working with the most popular search engines on the Internet;
- Skills for using equipment such as: digital camera, scanner, colour printer;
- Basic abilities for using digital processing software such as AdobePhotoshop cs2;
- Basic knowledge about photography. Experience in traditional and digital photography.
